## **Weakening surface near Cooke City**

Lots of <u>surface hoar</u>. Those crystals are often destroyed before being buried, but <u>surface hoar</u> is a good sign of weather conditions that are good for near surface faceting.

The upper few inches of snow is a mix of broken snowflakes that are starting to facet a little bit. Not too terrible yet.

Deeper layers of old November snow closer to the ground are faceted and breaking in <u>stability</u> tests. To get an avalanche breaking on those facets, I think you need an old <u>wind slab</u> on top. Even then, I think the sensitivity has dropped a lot.

We did see one recent wet loose avalanche that started near some exposed rocks in a place that typically gets wet. I did NOT see any wet loose slides in East and Southeast-facing gullies on Barronette peak. However, I'd be nervous ice climbing in these gullies when the sun is hitting them.
